1. Read Caesar's Gallic Wars: Books 1-7 ISBN: 0199540268 (or similar) OR

Buy the audiobook at <u>www.audible.com</u> look up "Julius Caesar the Commentaries Charlton Griffin"

2. Read Vergil's Aeneid (Use an Audiobook version) Recommended <u>www.audible.com</u> look up "Aeneid Simon Callow" (the translation is by Fagles)

\*\* Reasoning: The reason I **require** you to listen to the Aeneid and **suggest** you to listen to the Gallic Wars is because Ancient Literature was meant to be read aloud and usually was. \*\*

## **Reading Directions**:

- 1. Try to make time to do one book at a time and no more (about 1 hour).
- 2. Do not take notes while listening.
- 3. For each book of the Gallic Wars and of the Aeneid, make a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> to 1 page summary (typed double-spaced).
- 4. Before reading the next book, reread your previous summaries.
- 5. Do it when you have time to concentrate and focus, not while distracted with other things.

There will be a test at the beginning of the year – nevertheless passing a preliminary test at 80% or better will be required in order to enter the class.
