Lessons from Creation:

An Ecumenical Approach

The Psalmist David wrote, "The Heavens declare the glory of God," and, "The earth is the Lord's and the fulness thereof." The apostle Paul continued this theme when he said, "since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities--his eternal power and divine nature--have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made". Therefore, to study creation is to study the mind of the Creator. Plants and animals teach us so much about God who created them.

Children especially are sensitive to the beauty and wonder of the natural world. It makes sense, then, to ground their academic studies in such a way as to bring the outdoors into the classroom as well as find a classroom in the out of doors. The goal of this course is to provide families with tools to engage more deeply in exploration of creation and be shaped by this interaction to better apprehend the wisdom, love and creativity of God in all that He has made.

Scope and Sequence:

Each month will use picture books to focus on a particular virtue as modeled in the life of people who had a special love for creation. This will pair with stories from the wonderful 'Among the People' series that gives lessons from the animal kingdom in age appropriate stories. There will be art and cooking projects, suggested service opportunities and field trips, nature study assignments, copy-work, songs and poetry for memorization as well as a supplemental list of thematic picture books to enliven and support learning.
