In imitating Charles Dickens, we'll develop vivid, colorful characters. And in enjoying Jane Austen, we'll form precise dialogue. By the end of the camp, students will not only have a short story of their own, but they'll forge friendship with these magnificent authors.

PREREQUISITES:

Before beginning this course, students must read at least one work by EACH of these authors:


- J.R.R. Tolkien
- Charles Dickens
- Jane Austen

Students may also listen to audiobooks to fulfill this prerequisite.

EXPECATIONS:

- Students must be able to write full, well-developed paragraphs.
- Students must be able to edit their own work thoroughly.
- Students must be able to type independently and accurately as well as know how to navigate the word-processing program of their choice.
- Students must know terms such as: protagonist, antagonist, plot, problem, solution, and setting.
- Students must come to class having fulfilled the prerequisites listed above.

This camp is ideal for students having just finished WR2, 3, and 4.



HOMEWORK & GRADING:

- Students should be prepared to have ~1hr of homework after camp each day.
- There will be no grades for this camp.
