1. Artwork (JPEG)
2. Book/Movie Reviews and Recommendations (450 words)
3. Essays (450-950 words)
4. Photography (JPEG)
5. Poetry (Under 500 words)
6. Recipes (Must be typed; under 500 words)
7. Short Stories (Under 950 words)

8. Teacher Interviews (250-600 words)
9. Commonplace Quotes and Reflections (Under 200 words; Provide the work and the author's name)

Submission Details:

1. Submissions must be the student's original work.
2. Please submit written work as a PDF.
3. Please submit visual pieces as JPEGs.
4. Provide the creator's name, age, and grade in your email.
5. Write a brief biographical note and include it with the above information. Please do not include your location or last name.
6. Students ages 8-18 are permitted to submit pieces to the Chronicle.
7. **Please include a title** with your submission(s). If a collection of photography/artwork follows the same theme, then you may choose to name the compilation as a whole.
