Girl Genius

Course Description

This summer course is designed for girls entering grades 5-9 and will introduce the writings of St. John Paul II and what he called the *Feminine Genius*, at an age appropriate level that engages both the head and heart. Each class, girls can expect to experience prayer, discussion, journaling time, Bible study, in addition to hearing more about the dignity that God has given. The hope is that this course will help them navigate a world that gives them mixed messages of their worth.
