WEEKLONG "CAMP" FOR STUDENTS ENTERING GRADES 6-12

The Great Adventure Timeline (Ascension Press, Jeff Cavins, Fr. Mike Schmitz) has had great success in helping Catholics approach the Bible and dive into daily Scripture reading, study and prayer while still being rooted in the Church's teachings. Keeping that success in mind, this course will be using the Great Adventure Timeline to help students to see Scripture as the Living Word of God, a pillar of the Catholic Church, and the powerful story of Salvation History.

This summer course will be a quick "helicopter tour" of the Great Adventure Timeline and give students a framework and foundation to understand the Bible. The hope is that this course would serve as a gateway to more Scripture reading and study in the student's lives.

A typical class will include:

- Lectio Divina / Journal (Wisdom Books)
- Memory work
- Bible Question: Brief lecture / Q and A
- 5 minute break (snacks/stretch/etc)
- View Sacred Art
- Time Period: Take notes / draw
